What is a CEDS?

- Florida Planning Councils designated by U.S. Economic
 Development Administration as Economic Development Districts
- Planning Councils develop and adopt a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) through CEDS Committee
- CEDS committee represents both private and public sector
- Strategy analyzes regional economy, guides regional goals & objectives, identifies investment priorities and funding sources
- Creates road map to economic diversity through private sector investment and job creation

- Public Officials
- Representatives of Workforce Development Boards
- Representatives of Institutions of Higher Education
- Minority and Labor Groups
- Private Individuals

- Integration Into State's Five-Year Economic Development Strategic Plan




