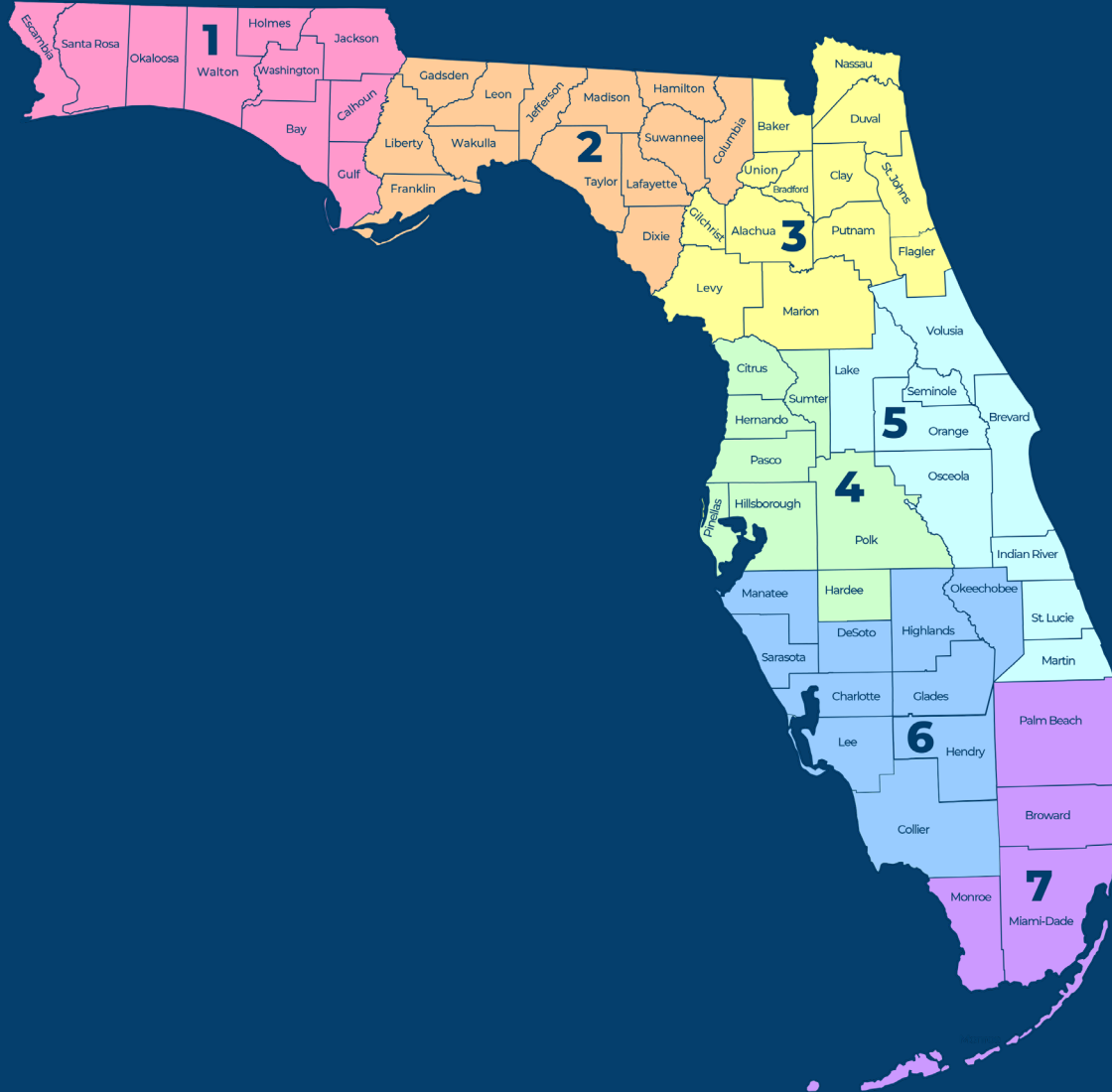

# Rebuild Florida Mitigation Programs

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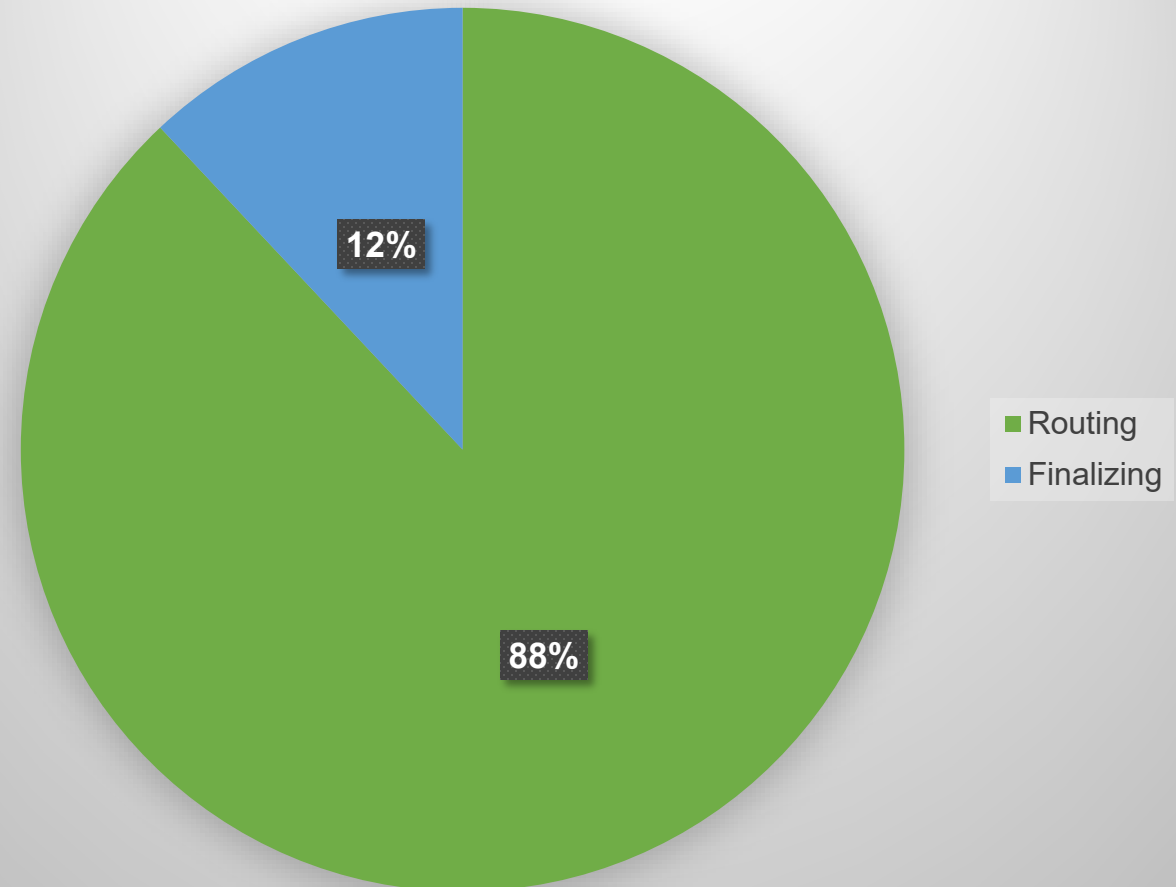
- **Rebuild Florida Critical Facility Hardening Program (CFHP; \$75 million)** – Designed to assist local governments and state agencies harden critical buildings that serve a public safety purpose for local communities.
- **Rebuild Florida General Planning Support Program (GPS; \$20 million)** – Designed to provide funding opportunities for local governments, educational institutions, state agencies, and non-profits to develop and update state, regional, and local mitigation plans.
- **Rebuild Florida Mitigation General Infrastructure Program (GIP; \$475 million)** – Designed to provide funding opportunities for local governments and state agencies to develop large-scale mitigation activities that allow Florida communities to better withstand future disasters.

# Office of Long-Term Resiliency: CDBG-Mitigation Updates



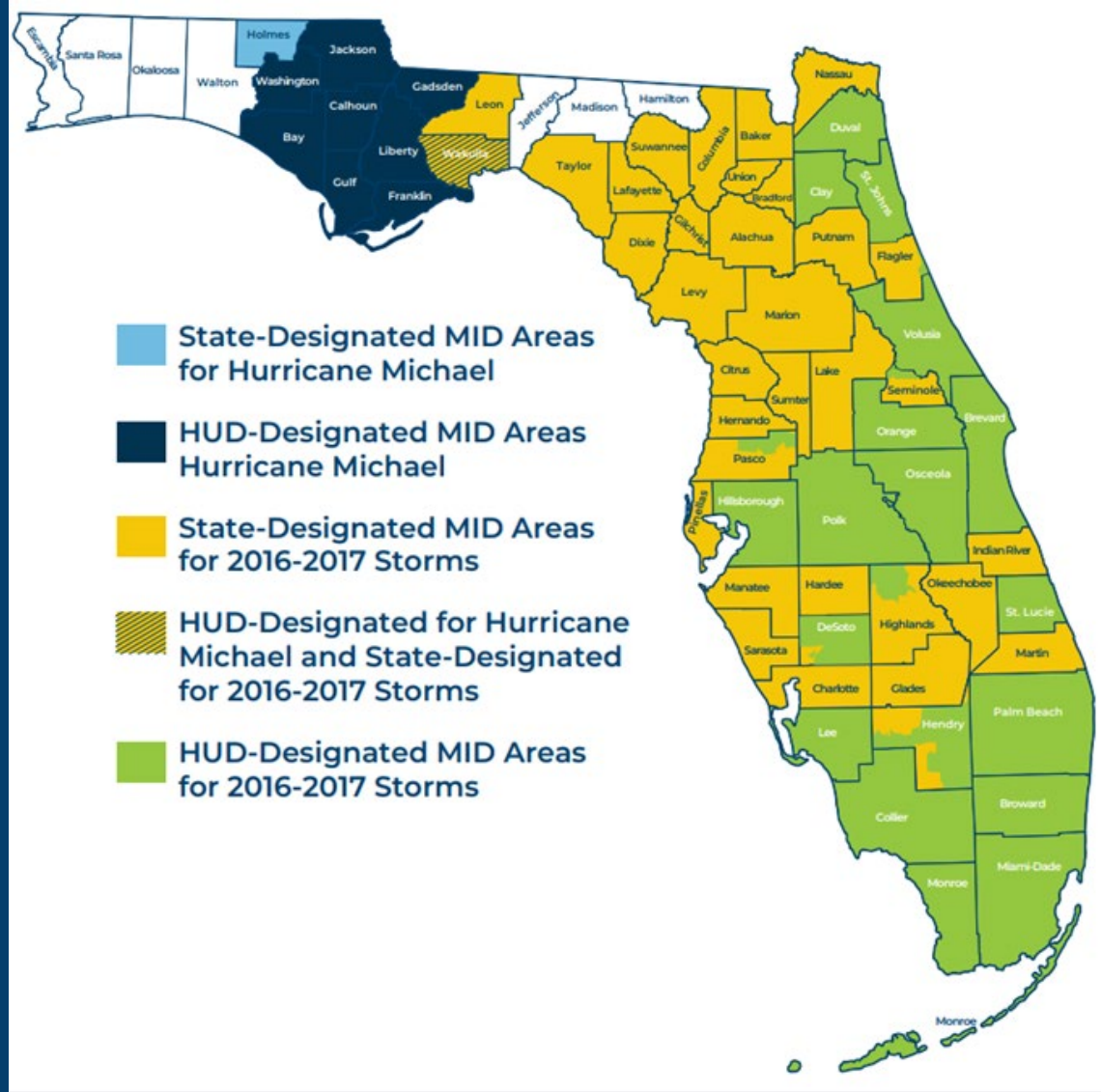
- The Mitigation Team has been working alongside awardees and subrecipients to move contracts to the execution phase. For the three initial programs, our progress is detailed below:
  - Total Agreements: 116;
  - Agreements routing/fully executed: 102;
  - Agreements remaining: 14
- 53% of subrecipients have initiated the Environmental Review Process.

# CDBG-MIT Eligibility Review

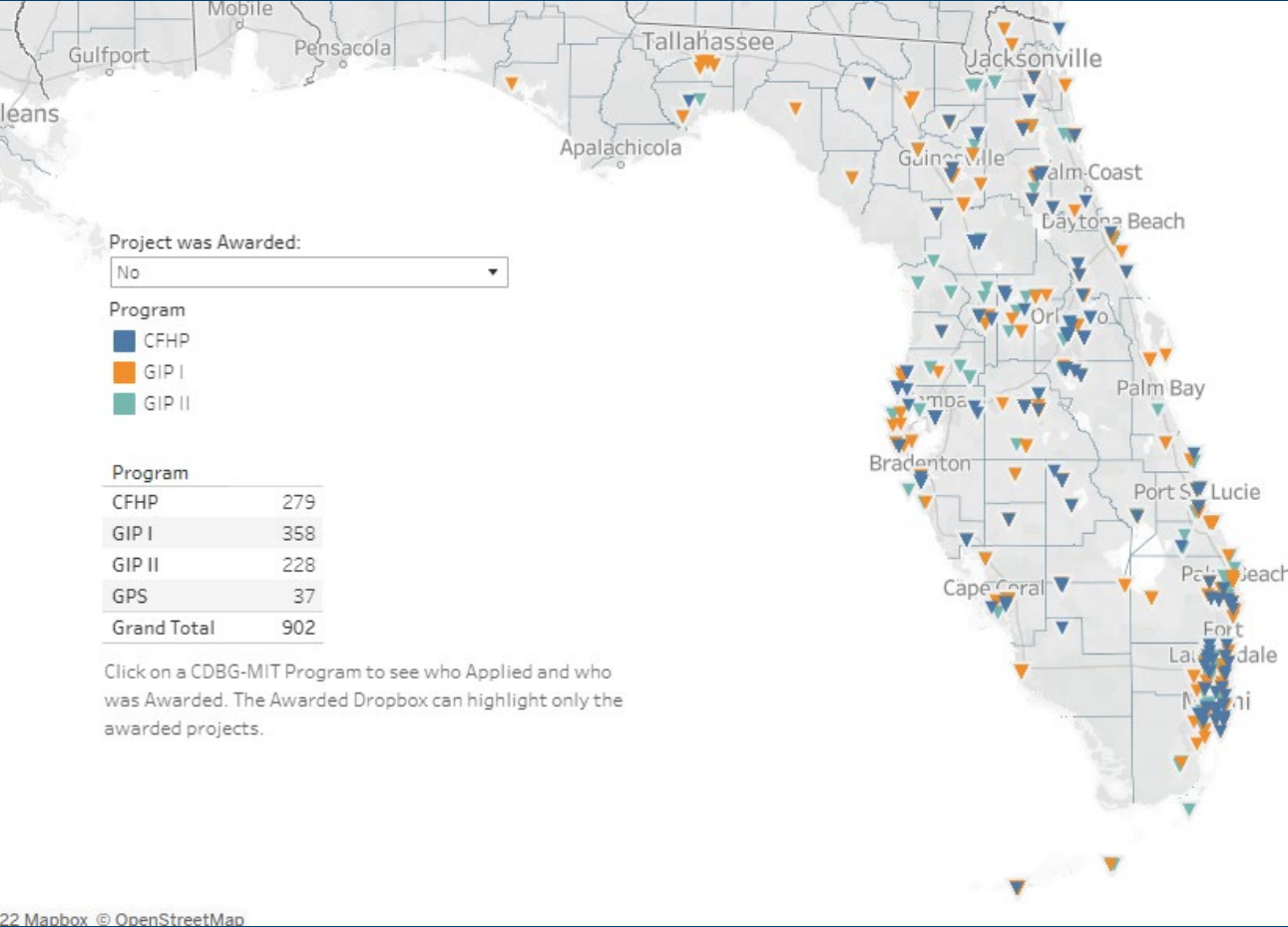
- **2016-2017 Disasters**
- Eligible Areas: Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and State Most Impacted and Distressed Areas (MID) eligibility
- 50% must be expended in HUD MID areas
- 50% must be expended in 6 years, 100% expended in 12 years
- Greatest Risk Hazards: Flooding, Severe Storms, Tropical Cyclones, Coastal Erosion, Wildfires

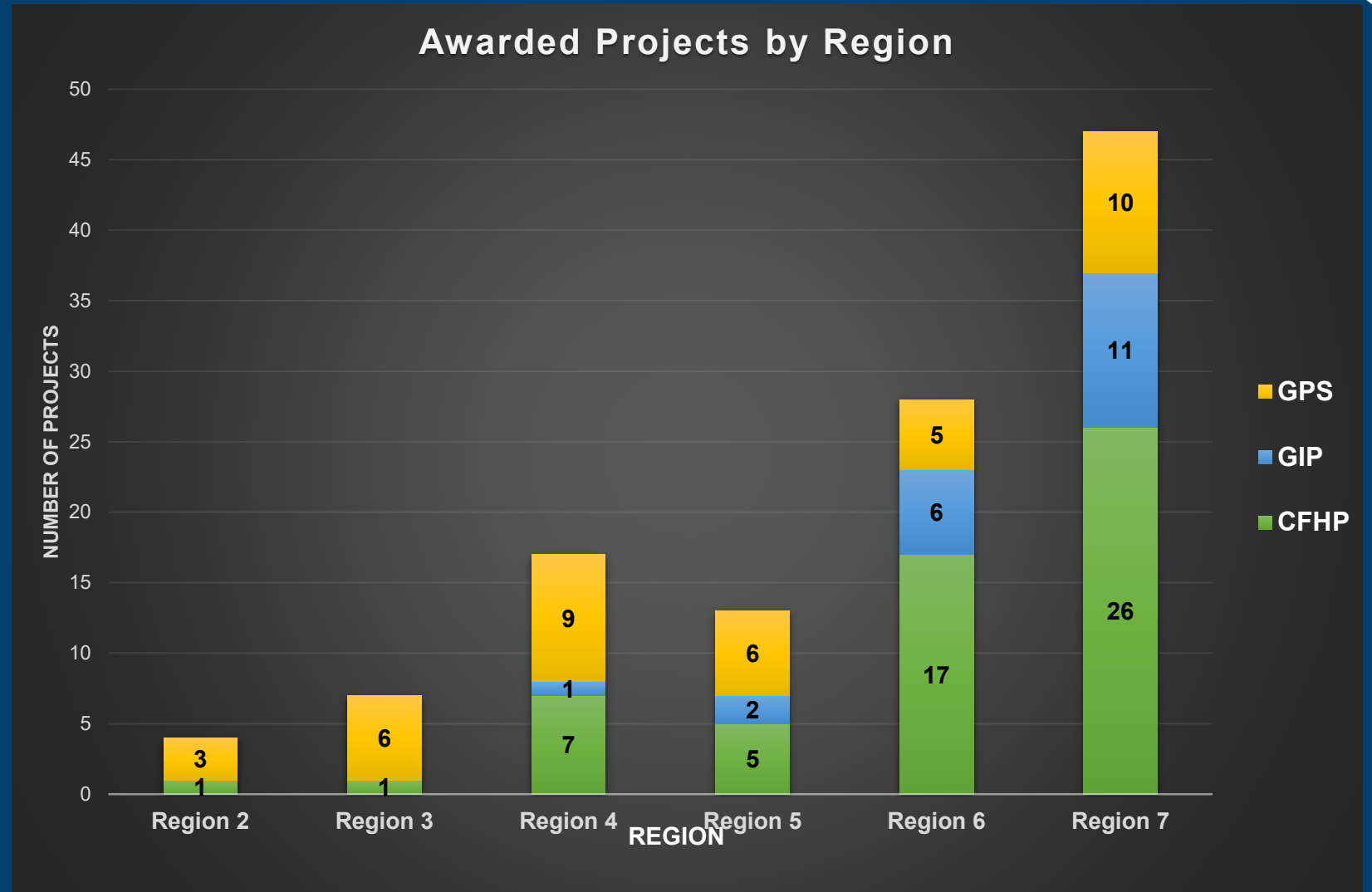

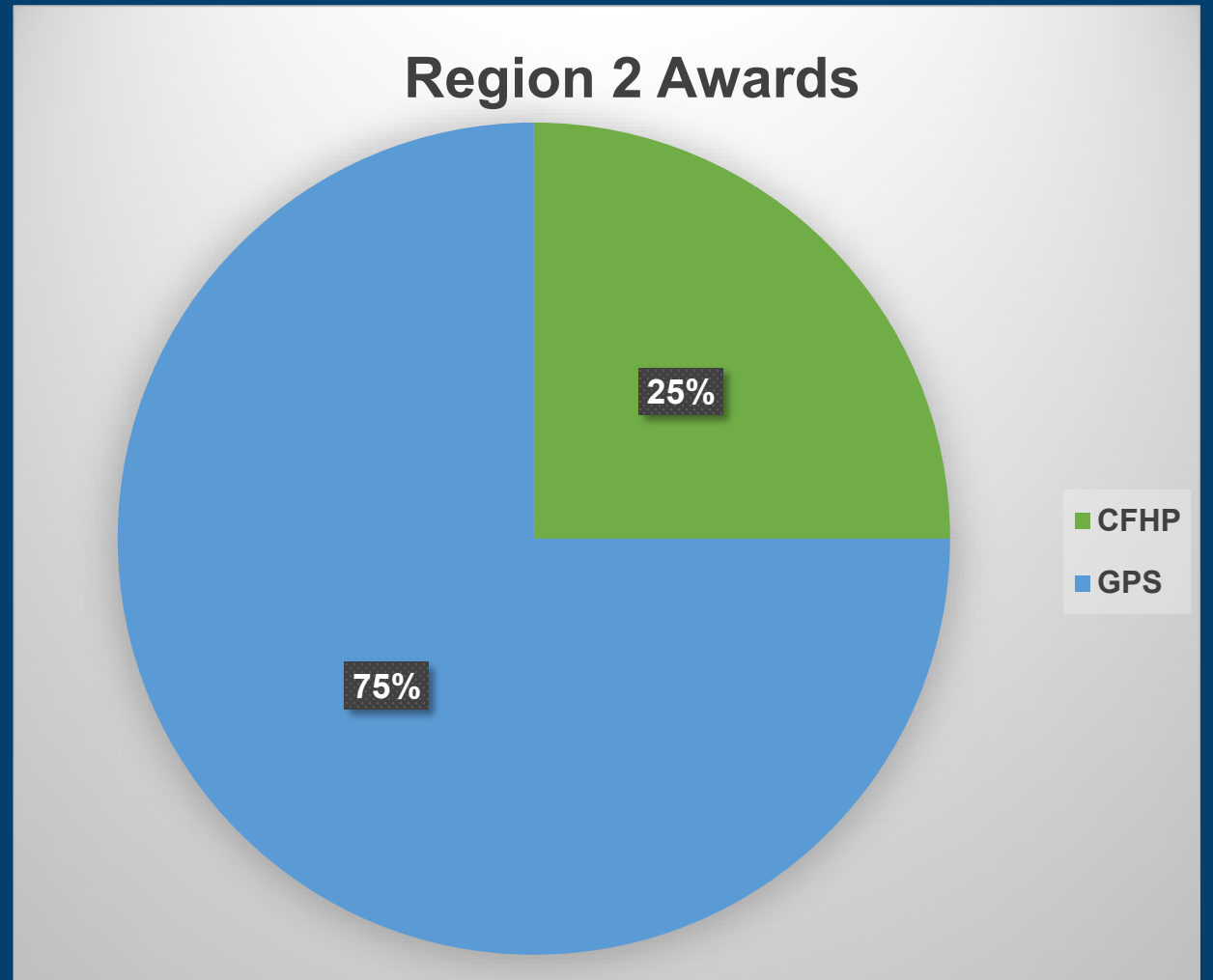
- Breakdown of awarded projects by program, for each region





# Region 2 Awarded Projects

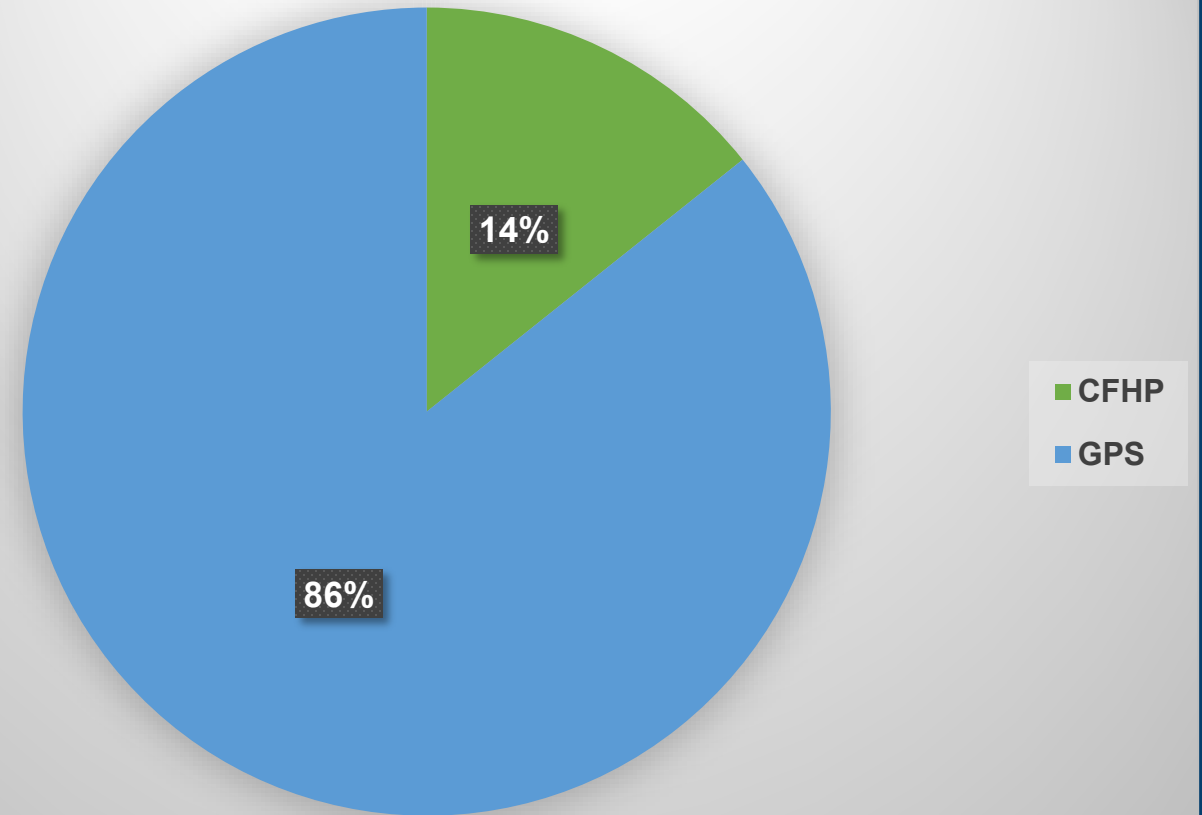
- Planning projects will benefit rural communities as well as Statewide stakeholders.
- Critical Facility projects benefit vulnerable populations during times of disasters.



# Region 3 Awarded Projects

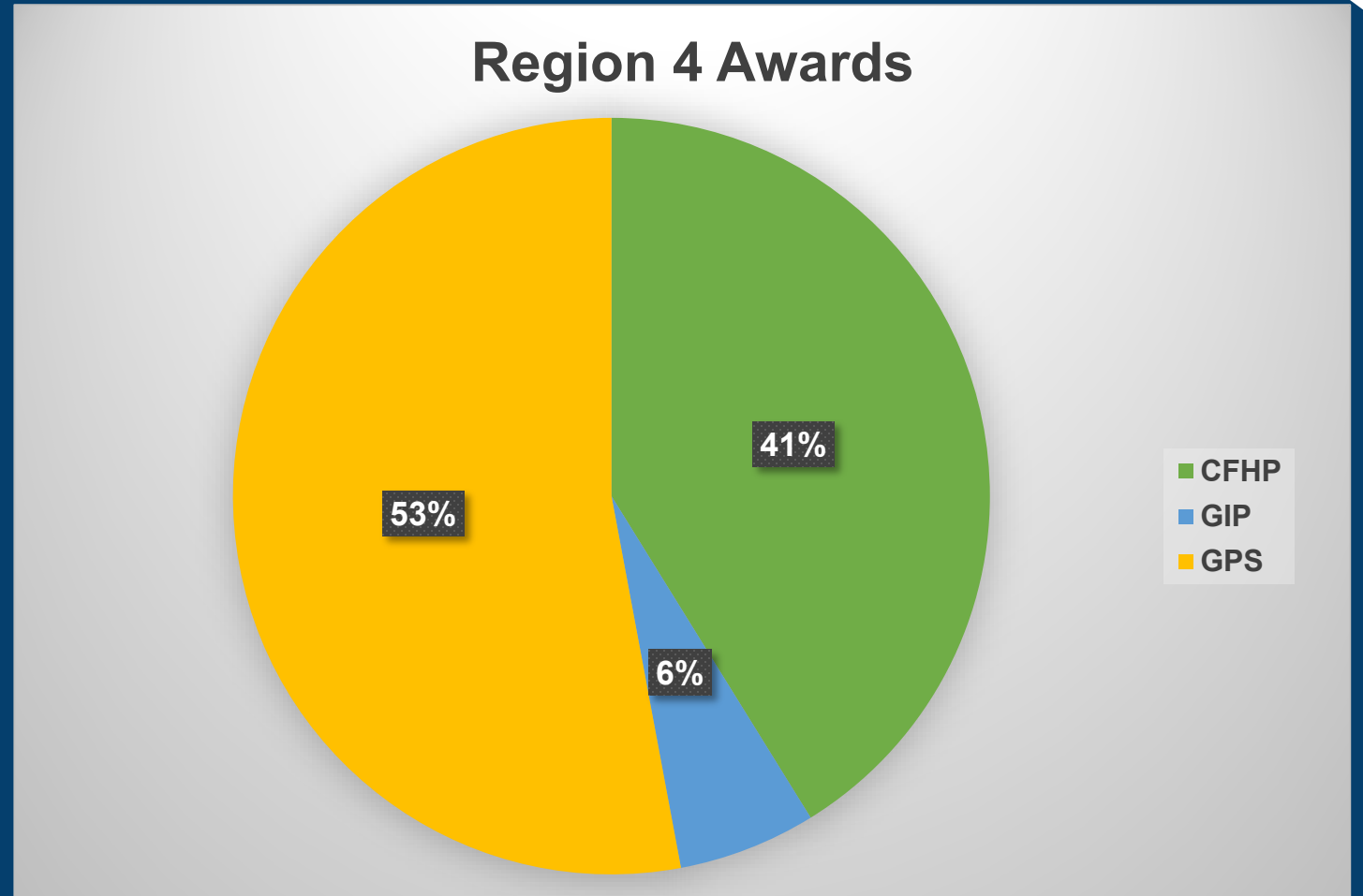
- Most projects in this area are in the Planning program and span a wide variety of resiliency measures, including Health and Medical Lifeline Plan, Wastewater Master Plan, Adaptation Plans.
- Critical Facility projects in this area benefit rural and vulnerable populations.

# Region 4 Awarded Projects

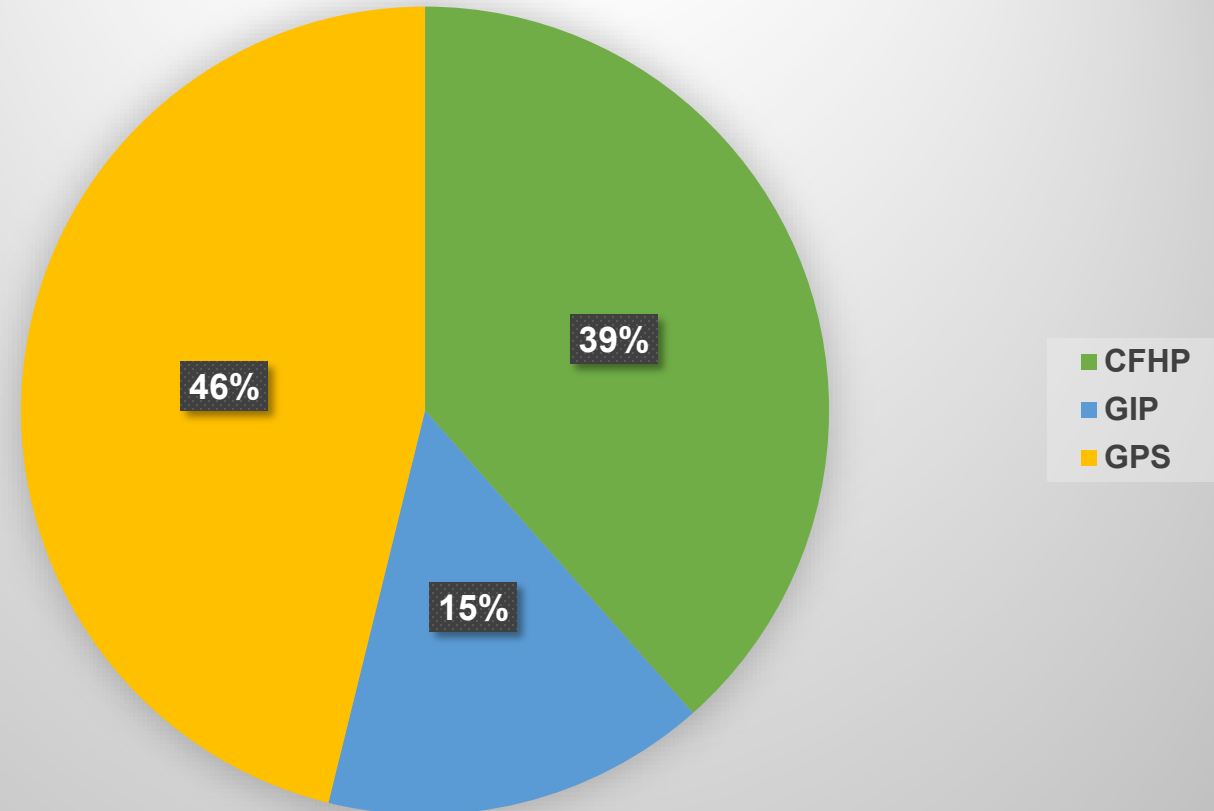
- Planning projects include Potable Water Plans, Flood Mitigation Plans, and Seawall Improvement Plans.
- Critical Facility Projects include improvements to Specialty/Indigent Care centers, Fire Stations, Water Treatment Plants, and Hurricane Shelters.



# Region 5 Awarded Projects

- Planning projects in this area include Regional Collaboration Plans, Mobility Infrastructure Plans, and Flood Mitigation Plans.
- Critical Facility projects include hardening of Police Stations, Fire Stations, and an Emergency Shelter.
- Infrastructure projects include drainage improvements and resiliency hubs.

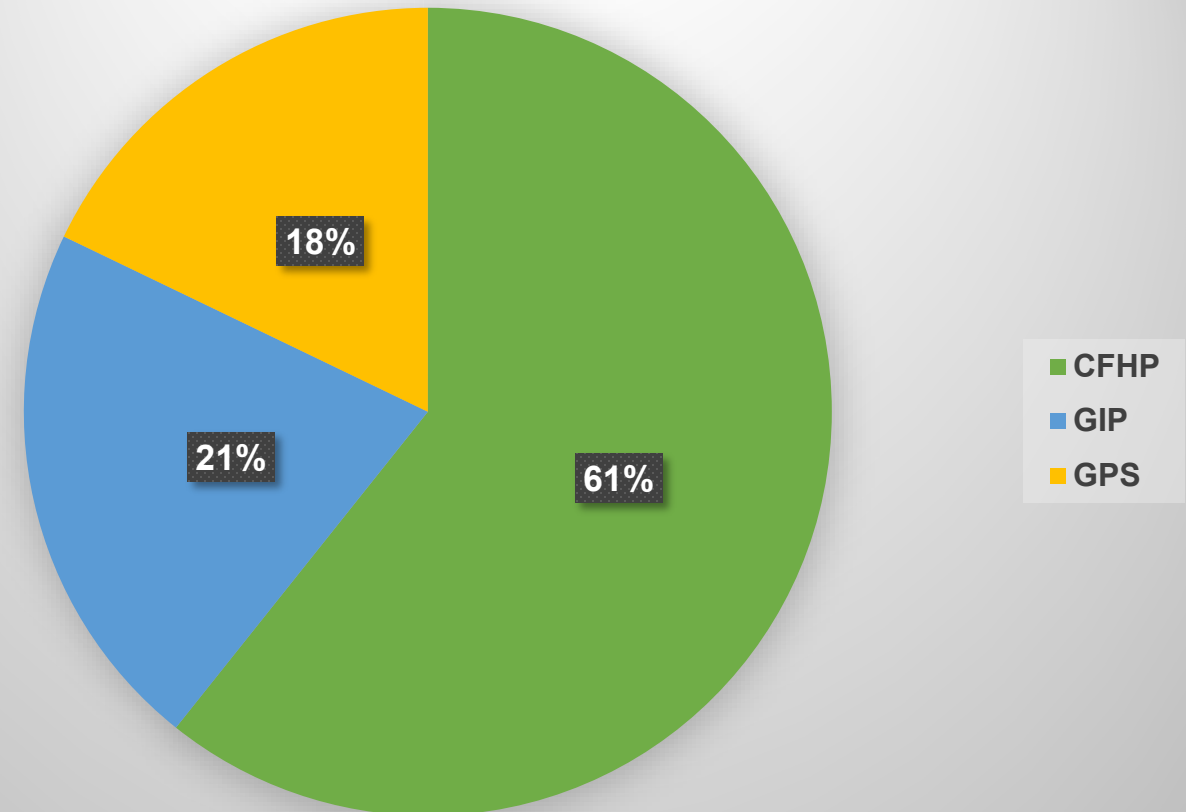

# Region 6 Awarded Projects

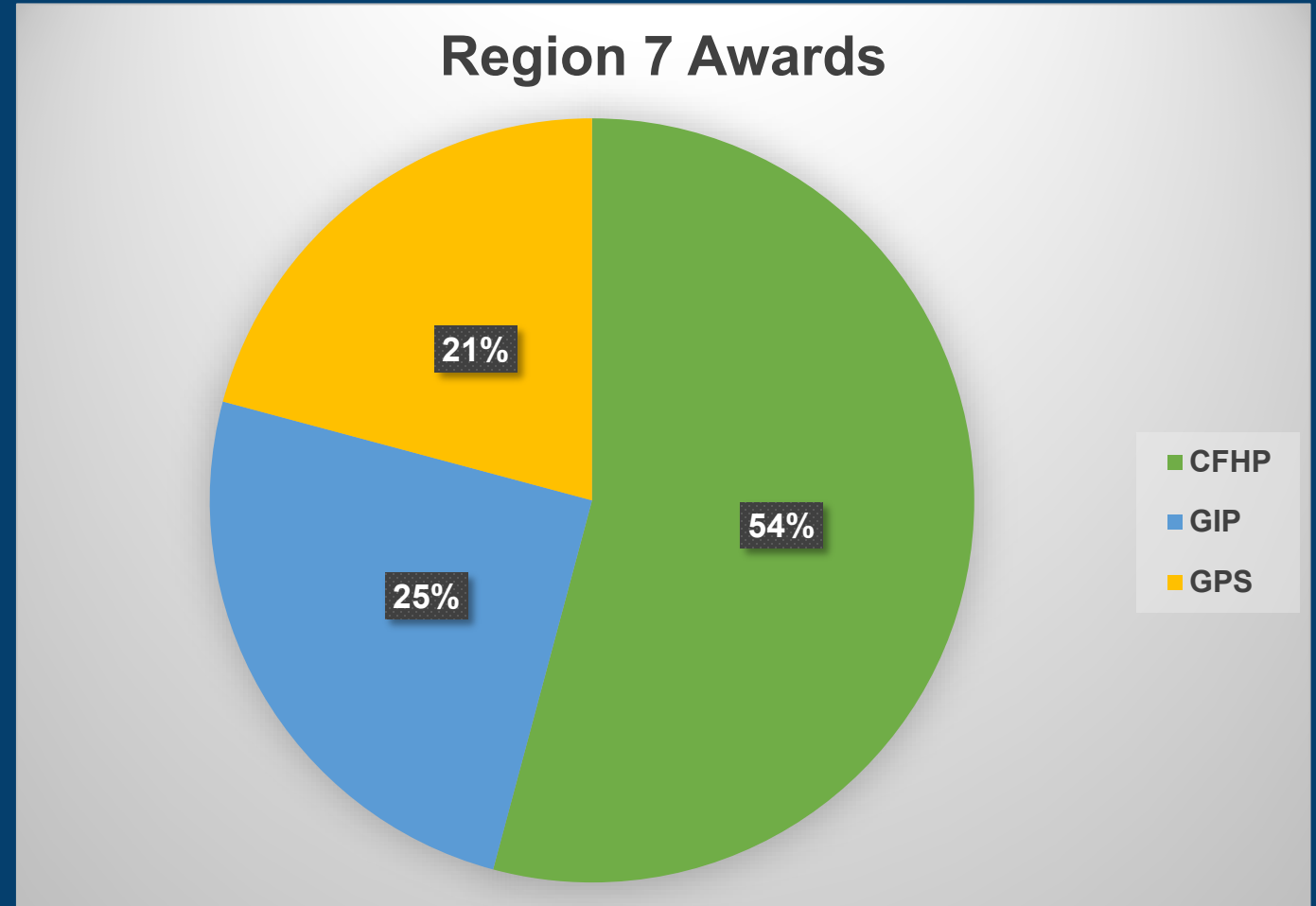
- Planning projects in this region include Resilience Planning for Food Supply, Modernization Planning, and Coastal Urban Risk Assessment Plans.
- Critical Facility projects include hardening storm shelters, senior centers, water plants, libraries, fire stations, and police stations.
- Infrastructure projects include water and sewer improvements, bridge strengthening, and flood control mitigation.

# Region 7 Awarded Projects

- Planning projects include public housing plans, resilience hub plans, flood mitigation/sea level rise plans, and economic resiliency plans.
- Critical Facility projects include hardening of water treatment plants, pump stations, police stations, fire stations, resilience hubs, and community centers.
- Infrastructure projects include sewer and water improvements, outfall upgrades, flood mitigation, and injection wells.



# General Infrastructure Program Round II

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- DEO has announced the following awards for GIP Round II:
  - City of Sarasota - \$10,418,271 – (Sarasota County) – Region 6
  - City of Bonita Springs - \$16,833,197 – (Lee County) – Region 6
  - City of Lake Butler - \$3,159,880 – (Union County) – Region 3
  - Broward County - \$16,676,000 – (Broward) – Region 7
  - City of Hallandale Beach - \$14,879,129 – (Broward) – Region 7
  - City of North Lauderdale - \$3,285,000 – (Broward) – Region 7
  - City of Opa-Locka - \$7,000,000 – (Miami-Dade) – Region 7
  - City of Miami - \$19,859,977 – (Miami-Dade) – Region 7
  - City of Miami - \$18, 447, 439 – (Miami-Dade) – Region 7

# General Infrastructure Program Round III

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- DEO has allocated more than \$346 million to the Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Hurricane Irma Housing Repair and Replacement Program (HRRP) activity delivery category.
- In order to serve additional impacted homeowners through the CDBG-DR Hurricane Irma HRRP, DEO has transferred \$150 million of CDBG-DR Hurricane Irma Infrastructure Repair Program projects to DEO's CDBG-MIT General Infrastructure Program to allow for an additional \$150 million in funding for the Hurricane Irma HRRP. DEO has amended the CDBG-MIT Action Plan to include these projects as Round III General Infrastructure Program Projects.
- Due to this shift in funding, DEO will not be opening an additional application cycle.

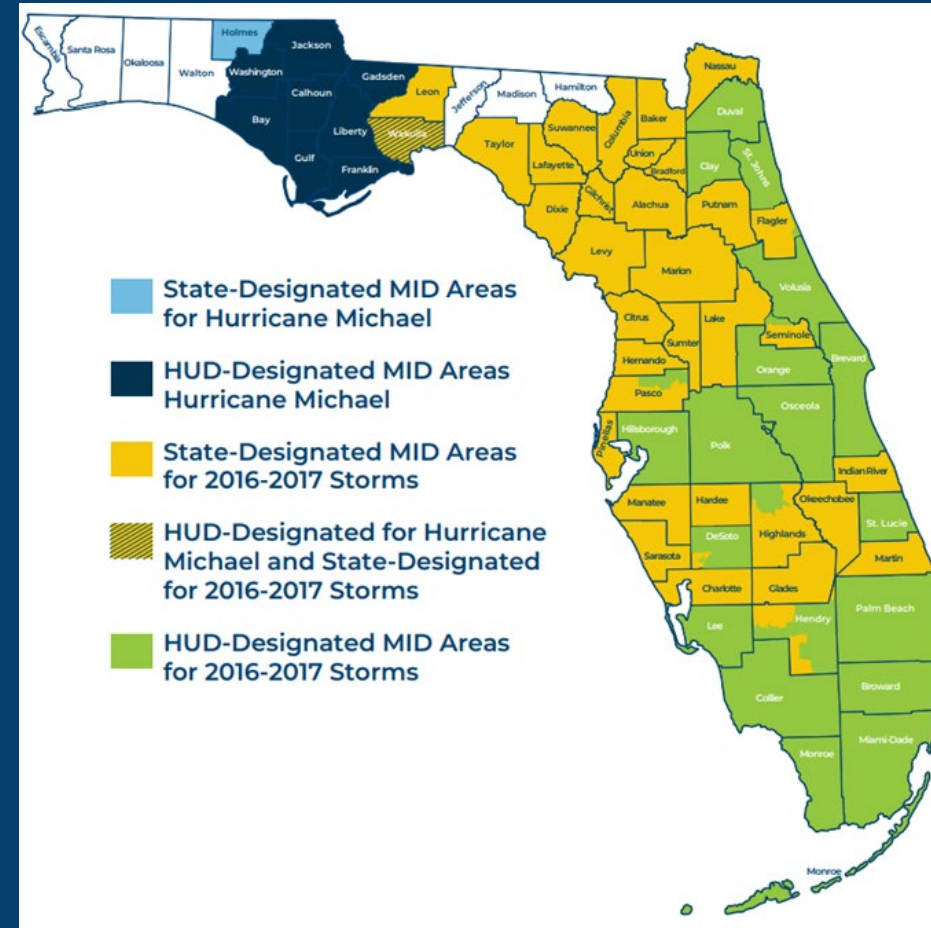
# CDBG-MIT Funding for Hurricane Michael-Impacted Areas
