SUBJECT: Draft Administrative Policy on Failure to meet Performance Standards

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) requires the provision of technical assistance to any regional workforce board (RWB) that fails one or more of the agreed to levels of performance in any program year. The law further requires the Governor to take "corrective actions" if the RWB fails the same agreed to levels of performance for a second year.

The new performance requirements under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) do not take effect until the newly required unified or Combined State Plan take effect on July 1, 2016. Until then, the performance standards under WIA remain.

The attached <u>draft Administrative Policy</u> provides guidance on how the state will meet its requirements to initiate technical assistance for an RWB that fails a performance standards in any year and how the state will apply "corrective actions" for an RWB that fails the same performance standard a second year. The Policy is being issued on consultation with comments due back 30 days from the date of this memorandum.
