ECONOMIC SELF-SUFFICIENCY WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

ABOUT

The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) is a federally funded program that helps income-eligible families with home weatherization costs. The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) administers WAP and allocates funding directly to a network of Community Action Agencies, also known as local WAP providers, located throughout the state of Florida.

WAP funds may provide funding for the following:

- Address air infiltration with weather stripping, caulking, thresholds, minor repairs to walls, ceilings and floors, and window and door replacement,
- Install attic and floor insulation (floors in northern Florida counties only),
- Install attic ventilation,
- Apply solar reflective coating to manufactured homes,
- Install solar screens,
- Repair or replace inefficient heating and cooling units, and
- Repair or replace water heaters.

ELIGIBILITY

WAP-eligible households must earn less than 200% of the national poverty level. Preference is given to elderly (60 years-plus) or physically disabled residents, families with children under 12, and households with a high energy burden (repeated high utility bills). The program's income limits are illustrated below:
