Dear Colleagues,

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Office of Community Services (OCS), Division of Energy Assistance (DEA), is releasing over \$385 million in funding for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2022. Congress appropriated these funds under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022 (Public Law 117-103), which provided the final budget for FFY 2022 and which the President signed into law on March 15, 2022.

On November 1, 2021, OCS released nearly \$3.37 billion of FY 2022 regular block grant funding under the Extending Government Funding and Delivering Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 117-43). The release reflected 90 percent of the total amount of funds available under the legislation to grant recipients at the beginning of the program year.

As of today, OCS has allocated 99 percent of non-supplemental LIHEAP funds available to LIHEAP grant recipients for FFY 2022. One percent of these funds has been reserved for the Secretary's transfer authority.

Congress previously appropriated \$100 million in supplemental LIHEAP funds under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, "IIJA", (Public Law 117-58). ACF released all of the IIJA supplemental LIHEAP funds for FY 2022 on January 25, 2022.
