SUBJECT: Availability of an Electronic Submission Process for Petitions

for Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA)

PURPOSE:

To transmit Training and Employment Notice (TEN) 14-10 that announces the implementation of an online electronic petition filing application process for the TAA Program.

BACKGROUND:

Previously, petitioners were able to go on-line and download the TAA petition application form (ETA Form 9042). Upon completion, the petitioner could then mail the form to the Office of Trade Adjustment Assistance and to the appropriate State Workforce Agency. The new process allows a petitioner to complete the form on-line and electronically submit the completed form to the appropriate agencies.
