**SUBJECT:** 2022 Poverty Guidelines

On January 21, 2022, the United States Department of Health and Human Services published the 2022 poverty guidelines in the Federal Register. These guidelines became effective January 12, 2022. The poverty guidelines are used to calculate income levels to determine if individuals meet the mandated requirements for funded services in various workforce programs.

Persons in Household	Poverty Guideline
1	\$13,590
2	\$18,310
3	\$23,030
4	\$27,750
5	\$32,470
6	\$37,190
7	\$41,910
8	\$46,630

For families/households with more than eight (8) persons, add \$4,720 for each additional person.
