SUBJECT: Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) for the Workforce Innovation and

Opportunity Act (WIOA)

PURPOSE

The United States Department of Labor published the 2018 LLSIL figures to the Federal Register on May 30, 2018. These figures are used to determine if individuals meet the definition of "low income" under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The income guidelines are also used to prioritize WIOA services for participants when funding is limited. Use of the updated income levels is effective May 30, 2018.

All Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDBs), except LWDB 3, are considered Metro and use the Metro LLSIL figures. LWDB 3 is considered Non-Metro and uses the Non-Metro LLSIL figures.

The 100 percent table for the LLSIL may be modified to calculate any locally determined values for prioritizing service or eligibility (i.e. 200 percent of LLSIL would multiply the 100 percent value times 2 for the appropriate family size).
