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Florida's June Employment Figures Released

TALLAHASSEE – Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for June 2009 is 10.6 percent. This represents 970,000 jobless out of a labor force of 9,192,000. The unemployment rate is 0.3 percentage point higher than the revised May rate of 10.3 percent and is up 4.6 percentage points from the June 2008 rate. The state's current unemployment rate is 1.1 percentage points higher than the national unemployment rate of 9.5 percent. The last time the unemployment rate was higher than June 2009 was October 1975 when it was 11.0 percent.

Florida's total nonagricultural employment in June 2009 is 7,379,400, representing a job loss of 392,800, or -5.1 percent compared to June 2008. This is steeper than the national rate of decline for June which is -4.1 percent over the year. The June 2009 job loss continues the trend of annual declines that began in August 2007. The downturn started with declines in construction jobs, but has now spread to almost all other major industries.

"As we work to support the many families impacted by this economic downturn, we take our responsibility to provide assistance very seriously," said Agency Director Cynthia R. Lorenzo. "Each and every day, we connect hundreds of thousands of people with our comprehensive array of Early Learning, Workforce, and Unemployment Compensation programs to help sustain families and reinvigorate our economy."

AWI annually provides assistance to more than 1.2 million Floridians through our Workforce Services and 370,000 children through the Agency's Early Learning programs. In addition, we are currently serving more than 560,000 people in our Unemployment Compensation programs. In some cases, families experiencing unemployment are assisted through all three divisions to help meet multiple needs. This month AWI also began paying Recovery Act-funded Extended Benefits to eligible Floridians who have exhausted all other state and federal unemployment compensation benefits. By the end of today, the Agency expects to have paid more than \$100 million to more than 60,000 people. Approximately 250,000 Floridians will receive an estimated \$418 million in Extended Benefits by the end of the year.

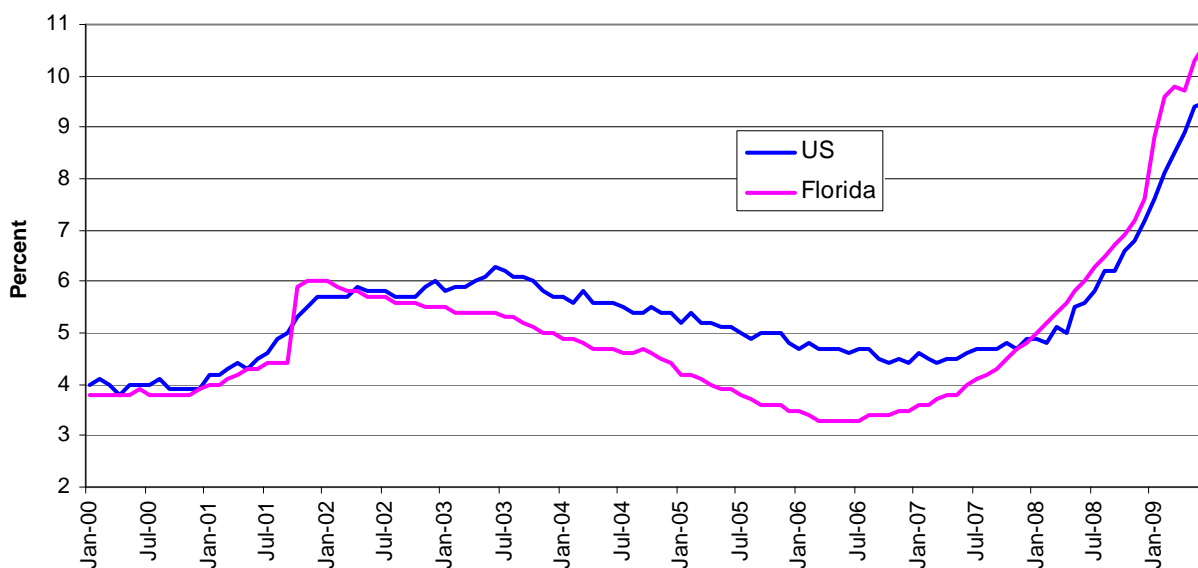

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida is down 392,800 in June 2009 compared to a year ago. The industry losing the most jobs is professional and business services (-88,500 jobs, -7.7 percent).
- Other industries losing jobs over the year include: trade, transportation, and utilities (-86,300 jobs, -5.4 percent); construction (-80,400 jobs, -15.6 percent); leisure and hospitality (-48,500 jobs, -5.1 percent); manufacturing (-42,300 jobs, -11.3 percent); financial activities (-22,600 jobs, -4.3 percent); other services (-12,400 jobs, -3.6 percent); information (-12,300 jobs, -7.9 percent); and total government (-5,200 jobs, -0.5 percent).
- These industry job losses are partially due to weakness in employment services; motor vehicle and parts dealers; specialty trade contractors; food services and drinking places; fabricated metal product manufacturing; credit intermediation; repair and maintenance; telecommunications; and local government.
- Private education and health services (+5,800 jobs, +0.6 percent) is the only sector gaining jobs among Florida's major industries. All of the increase is due to health services (+10,000 jobs, +1.1 percent), primarily in nursing and residential care facilities. Private education declined by 4,200 jobs (-3.1 percent) over the year.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2009, Liberty County has the state's lowest unemployment rate (5.5 percent), followed by Franklin and Monroe counties (6.6 percent each); Walton County (6.7 percent); Okaloosa County (7.1 percent); and Leon and Wakulla counties (7.2 percent each). Many of the counties with low unemployment rates have a relatively high percentage of government workers and higher tourism during the summer months.
- Flagler County, at 15.5 percent, has the highest unemployment rate in Florida in June, followed by Indian River and St. Lucie counties (14.1 percent each); Hendry County (13.9 percent); Hernando County (13.1 percent); and Lee County (13.0 percent). Flagler County has the highest unemployment rate in the state for the seventh consecutive month. The area's high jobless rate is mainly due to continued weakness in construction and manufacturing. There were 40 Florida counties with double-digit unemployment rates in June 2009, up from 33 in May 2009.

Area Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- All metro areas in the state lost jobs over the year in June 2009. Metro areas with the largest annual declines include Miami-Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach (-96,400 jobs, -4.1 percent); Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (-55,400 jobs, -4.5 percent); and Orlando-Kissimmee (-55,100 jobs, -5.1 percent).
- The Palm Coast MSA (-1,600 jobs) has the smallest annual decline. The Tallahassee MSA has the smallest rate of job decline, -2.1 percent over the year.

Note: These unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the US Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the US Census Bureau under contract with the US Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the US Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Unemployment Compensation tax records and other data.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics added the Palm Coast Metropolitan Statistical Area (Flagler County) to the published nonagricultural employment series.
