WIOA youth funds are targeted for young people who are both in and out-of-school.

Out-of-School Youth Requirements

Out-of-School Youth are individuals who are not attending school, between the ages of 16 to 24 and is one or more of the following:

- School dropouts
- Homeless youth, runaways, foster children.
- Youth with a disability.
- · Youth who are subject to the juvenile or adult justice system.
- Youth who are school age, but have not attended school for the most recent complete school year calendar quarter.
- Recipients of a secondary school diploma or its Homeless youth, runaways, foster recognized equivalent who are low income individuals and are basic skills deficient or English language learners.
- Low-income youth who require additional assistance to enter or complete an educational program or to secure or hold employment

In-School Youth Requirements

In-of-School Youth are individuals who are attending school, between the ages of 14 to 21.

- Basic skills deficient
- English language learner
- Offenders
- Pregnant or parenting
- Youth with disabilities
