SUBJECT: Lower Living Standard Income Level for the Workforce Innovation and

Opportunity Act

PURPOSE

The United States Department of Labor published the 2019 Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) tables to the Federal Register on May 29, 2019. These tables are used to determine if individuals meet the definition of "low income" under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). WIOA defines the term "low income individual" as one whose total family annual income does not exceed the higher level of the poverty line or 70 percent of the LLSIL. The information in the LLSIL tables is effective May 29, 2019.

All Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDBs), except LWDB 3, are considered Metro and use the Metro LLSIL figures. LWDB 3 is considered Non-Metro and uses the Non-Metro LLSIL figures.

The 100 percent table for the LLSIL may be modified to calculate any locally determined values for prioritizing service or eligibility (i.e. 200 percent of LLSIL would multiply the 100 percent value times two for the appropriate family size).
